Meaning of Baptism.

The priest *pours* water on the candidate's head while saying: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The gift of Baptism is completed after those words.

Baptismal Oil:

Baptismal Oil strengthens the person's faith during Baptism. Baptismal Oil symbolizes the gifts from the Holy Spirit. Usually, holy oils are used when the Holy Spirit cleanse you.
