

## Summer Work for Rising First Graders

It is highly recommended that your child continue to practice math, reading, and writing during the summer. You can also use the leftover math pages that are going home in the K math workbooks. Students have started a journal in class which is meant to be continued during the summer. Encourage your child to write and illustrate daily. Some fun topics are: events, national holidays, family and friends, lists, vacations, camp, saints, or anything else that might come to mind. Finally, there is a reading list posted on the website for everyone's reading pleasure.

I recommend your child practices the following:

Calendar skills

Number line math (what numbers come before, after, in between)

Writing numbers up to 31 correctly

Skip counting (by 2's, 5's, and 10's)

Completing patterns

Interpreting graphs

Time (to the hour and the half hour)

Money (recognizing coins and their value)

Addition and subtraction up to 10
