Going home in today's Wednesday folder is the information needed for parents to access PowerSchool's Parent Portal to see your children's current grades and follow their progress. If you are new to St. Ambrose you will need to create your account first. You can then link all children to one account.

Message from the Nurse:

Flu Shots:

It's that time of year that the cold and flu season is fast approaching. Please make sure that you remind your children to wash or sanitize their hands frequently. Clean hands help slow the spread of viruses and bacteria.

If you wish to get a flu shot this year, it's a good time to call your pediatrician to set up a shot appointment or see if they are having flu shot clinics. You can also go to your local pharmacy such as Walgreens or CVS. Walgreens is providing flu shots for children 4 years of age and older. No appointment is necessary. CVS has two options, if the CVS has a Minute Clinic, you can make an appointment and they provide flu shots for children 2 years of age and older. If your child is 12 years of age or older you can go to the pharmacy

without an appointment and receive a flu shot. Most insurance is accepted at both pharmacies, but if you have any questions please call prior to going.

Daily Health Form:

Thank you to everyone that has been filling out the morning Health Assessment. It is a valuable tool to keep our school open and everyone safe and healthy. As a reminder, the Google form will be sent out via email each morning at 5:30 am. Check your junk mail if it is not in your inbox. You might have to mark it as safe. Please make sure you fill one out for each student attending. If one of your children has a fever, all of your children need to remain home until they can each be cleared by a physician, and documentation is provided to the school. A fever is considered anything above 100 degrees F. If you have any questions about this please let me know.
