





Average minimum and maximum temperature over the year




Panamá has a tropical climate. The humidity increases the closer you get to the ocean or bodies of water, and gets slightly cooler in more mountainous places.





The Gala Pollera is traditionally worn by the women and normally adorned with many different types of jewelry.





The Gala Pollera is adorned with these head combs. The larger comb is called "peineton".

A Montuno is not considered complete without this hat. It is called a "Sombrero Pintado". Colombia influences the food of Panamá more than Central America. Therefore meat, particularly beef, and seafood are prominent foods. Everyday meals typically consist of meat, roots found locally -such as potatoesrice and greens.
